4. <u>  H  </u> Llano Grane	D. Comanche chief who was leader of a band in the area surrounding La Bahia.
5. <u>  G  </u> Chepillo	E. Lipan Apache who was appointed Captain General of the Tonkawa by the Spanish in 1779.
6. <u>  F  </u> Pedro José	F. Karankawa leader who brought his group and others to Espiritu Santo Mission.
7. <u>  A  </u> Canoso	G. An Aranama who changed from resident at Mission Rosario to warrior fighting Spanish.
8. <u>  D  </u> Malla	H. Karankawa chief and his band were original members of Refugio Mission on Garcitas Creek.
